Stroke Corner: Featured CSM Session: More Than Apraxia: Role of Motor Planning in Skilled Movement After Stroke

There is so much great Stroke content this year at CSM, including the education session titled "More Than Apraxia: Role of Motor Planning in Skilled Movement After Stroke" from Jill Campbell Stewart, PT, PhD, Hui-Ting Goh, PT, PhD, Shailesh Kantak, PT, PhD and Sue Peters, PT. Planning is vital to the successful performance of skilled motor actions and involves cognitive and perceptual-motor processes that occur prior to movement execution. The planning aspects of movement are heavily studied in the context of motor control in healthy adults, and conditions of practice that benefit motor learning often challenge planning-related processes. After stroke, most rehabilitation approaches

focus on execution-related deficits and only address planning from the perspective of apraxia, a specific type of planning disorder. However, movement deficits after stroke in individuals without apraxia are influenced by poor motor planning. Given the importance of planning in the performance of everyday functional tasks, planning should be considered in stroke rehabilitation even for individuals without apraxia. In this session, speakers will define several motor planning processes that are important for skilled motor task performance and the role of these processes in motor control and motor learning. Attendees will learn about behavioral and neural changes in motor planning in individuals with and without diagnosed apraxia, including both upper extremity and lower extremity tasks. Speakers will present intervention principles for incorporating a challenge to motor planning in addition to movement execution during functional training, with examples from ongoing work.
