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Stroke Corner Topic: Value of Therapy in Post-Acute Care

Have you heard about the TOPS Study?

Due to significant Medicare payment policy changes in 2019 and 2020 that impact incentives for therapy in post-acute care - the Patient Driven Payment Model, or PDPM in Skilled Nursing Facilities (SNFs) and PDGM- The Patient Driven Groupings Model in Home Health, the APTA and AOTA got together to study the value of therapy in Inpatient Rehab Facilities (IRFs), SNFs and Home Health Agencies (HHAs).

The Therapy Outcomes in Post-Acute Care Settings, or TOPS study, set out to examine the relationship between therapy intensity (amount of physical and occupational therapy per post-acute stay) and outcomes in post-acute care.

Bottom Line:

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The TOPS study found that therapy intensity is directly and positively related to improvements in patient functional ability across postacute settings.

Patients who receive physical and occupational therapies during their initial post-acute care episode are less likely to be readmitted and more likely have better outcomes, such as survival, functional ability, quality of life, and participation in daily living.
